The meeting was called to order at 7:20 pm by Chairman Meyer.

Roll Call was taken with nine (9) members present.

The meeting being duly posted and a quorum present, the Chairman proclaimed this meeting to be a legal meeting and acknowledged that the Open Meeting Act was posted in the meeting room.

Motion by Joseph Smith and seconded by Dave Larson to approve the agenda. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Diana Hurlburt and seconded by Tom Bandur to approve the April 1, 2024 Minutes (postponed from March 29, 2024). Ayes (6) Nays (0) Abstain (3).

Motion by Doug Pokorny and seconded by Dave Larson to approve the March 2024 Financial Statement. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Towers & Equipment Report:

• Alma introduced Klint Arnold from Stealth Broadband that had attended meeting due to purchasing the equipment from Applied Connective that is located on our Greeley tower site. Klint had informed the board that in purchasing the broadband side of Applied Connective that they acquired the equipment at our site and had reached out before about access to the tower but would need a new agreement between them and Region 26. The purchase had been done in April 2023. He was asked about new equipment that had been placed on the tower without our consent. He said he did not think anything had been added and then found out they had an emergency situation of losing a site and had to add a small point to point dish. Klint said they are not supposed to add anything to tower without our knowledge or acceptance which is their goal. The board discussed with him what they were expecting for service including keeping the

two cameras updated that was part of the Applied Connective agreement and if we can work out something that the landowner would accept and our board would approve. The agreement Stealth had sent was reviewed and pointed out changes that we would like to see made. Jay told him we did not want being exclusive on tower and can't request that from us. Klint said he can work with that and does not need to be any more than 150' on the tower. Our agreement with landowner is that anything extra going on the tower that generates revenue, they are to be notified. Klint said to send him the changes that we were requesting in the agreement and he would work on that. Jay said he was to negotiate with Alma and the Board could look it over at next meeting to approve. Jay asked about revenue he would pay Region 26 and going back to the starting date and he said yes, they would look at that.

- Alma reported on the Litchfield tower being struck by lightning in this last week's storm which
 had possibly done damage to the generator and transfer switch. Power Tech was going to check
 it out and get back to us with damages and a quote on what needs replaced. Platte Valley was
 out to get us temporarily up and running. We would check on how and who was paying for this
 when we get more information.
- Spalding paging was not working well for Spalding Fire and Rescue. The equipment is located on a city owned tower. Platte Valley from Grand Island came out to repair. It was a power supply that was causing voltage problems. There were other problems when they arrived with a hole in roof of building. The fire chief in Spalding was going to take care of that.
- Alma had Platte Valley in Kearney look over the radio and page situation at Ashton and Rockville Looking over the options that we have in those two towns of what might work for both places.
- Alma pointed out the increased cost of lines into backup site from the west counties. The board
 discussed at length the cost of these lines and feel we need to have them disconnected at this
 time and use other means of backup and could see if there is something else that could be used.
 The additional phone lines for 911 can be reduced to one line into the backup site.

Jordan Foltz made a motion with a second from Tom Bandur to shut down communications line for backup from west counties and two extra phone lines for the backup center.

Alma presented a preliminary budget for the board to review which took into account the amount for wage increases for last year and this year both. The budget was discussed at length.

The equipment cost for insurance was discussed at the tower sites and what it would do for the counties if the equipment in each County was shifted to the county insurance instead of Region 26 covering the costs. The board asked for Alma to breakdown the policy and send the amount out to each county for them to quote the amount with NIRMA to see if that would be an option.

Criminal Justice Board Report: Alma reported that there would be a Law Enforcement meeting this Friday with the Departments and Dispatch.

Communications Center Report: Alma reported that there had been a new dispatcher hired from Taylor and has started her training.

Director's Report:

- Alma gave a report on the recent fires. One on April 13th in Wheeler County that required aerial suppression from Arrow Aviation. Four separate fires happened on April 15th in Cherry, Thomas and Hooker that was due to dry lightning and high winds that total 4000+ acres. Disaster Declarations had been turned in for those counties affected.
- Mutual Aid Meetings were attended with the Task Force development being the topic at Loup Valley Mutual Aid and the recent complex fires discussed at Sandhills Mutual Aid.
- There were three tornadoes in Region 26 on Friday the 26th . Two were located in Sherman and

one in Greeley County. Disaster declarations were turned in for both counties. Alma reported on meeting with Hastings Weather Service and starting in Sherman to track down the tornado paths to allow them to determine size and wind speed. Also, it allowed us to make a report of damages to NEMA for possible State declaration and FEMA assistance. There were enough damages from the Public Power Districts to meet the County thresholds; Loup Valley PPD reporting \$14,000, Dawson PPD \$15,000, NPPD \$744,000 and Howard Greeley \$245,724 (Substation in Howard Co at \$812,000).

• The June 12th date is still on track for Region 26 to install the upgrade of 911 next generation equipment.
