The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by Chairman Meyer.

Roll Call was taken with nine (9) members present.

The meeting being duly posted and a quorum present, the Chairman proclaimed this meeting to be a legal meeting and acknowledged that the Open Meeting Act was posted in the meeting room.

Motion by Diana Hurlburt and seconded by Joseph Smith to approve the agenda. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Motion by Diana Hurlburt and seconded by Tom Bandur to approve the July 30, 2024 Meeting Minutes. Ayes (8) Nays (0) Abstain (1).

Alma explained the budget report and how the grants were listed for spend down. Some of the reimbursement came through in August and does not show on the report ending the fiscal year in July. Motion by Tom Bandur and seconded by Diana Hurlburt to approve the July 2024 Financial Statement. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

Towers & Equipment Report:

- Alma reported on the security cameras that were updated and the large screen in the EOC utilizing the EOC grant funds.
- Alma had a planning meeting last week with the Sherman County Law Enforcement, Fire Chiefs, EMS and Commissioner to discuss the best options for better communications in the County to reach back to dispatch. Radio communications providers were in attendance to help with planning and suggestions of what would work.
- The generator at Litchfield tower needs repair work done after the last lightning damage that we had repairs done to the transfer switch. The control panel needs replaced or update of generator. The generator quote from Power Tech was \$6300.

- Platte Valley from Grand Island came today to install the new alarm panels at the Sargent and Ord towers. Our Silent Knight system is now offline and alarms will come from the Central Alarm company by telephone call and to cell phone. They assisted in the security camera install for the EOC while here.
- The new Cameras have been installed at Greeley Tower site. We need to approve the signing of the contract with Stealth Broadband, and will be on the next agenda. They will be adding the camera views with our security cameras that we have in the building here.
- The Garfield Equipment was discussed and the repeater is in and ready for install.

Criminal Justice Board Report: Loup County Sheriff, Dustin Spanel was introduced as the alternate for the Criminal Justice Board and that Sherman County Sheriff, Joel Bergman would be the representative on the board taking the place of Sheriff King. However, Sheriff Bergman was unable to attend tonight due to a training conflict. Dustin reported on the Law Enforcement meeting that was held on August 2nd. He stated that the dispatch center done a terrific job during the Burwell Rodeo week with all other traffic from other counties that was happening at the same time. Dustin talked about the CodeRed system being discussed at the meeting and how it could be utilized better if the Sheriffs could have access to the system and put out messages instead of relaying to the office. He said it would be something for them to discuss more.

Communications Center Report: Statistics breakdown for the previous month were passed out. They had 1758 Status, 337 Wants/Warrants/Registrations, 327 Pages, 264 Traffic Violations, 137 Messages, 109 – 911 Accidental/Disconnect, 105 Minor Detail, 100 Rescue Calls, 75 Assist Citizen, 52 Standby for Events/Fire/Training, 50 Burn Permits, 48 Accidents, 45 Assist Other Agencies, 44 Gun Permits, 42 Livestock Complaint, 38 Weather, 26 Disturbance/Harassment/Assault, 25 Paper Service, 22 Reckless Driver, 16 Animal Calls, 15 Motorist Assist, 14 Suspicious Person, 11 Suspicious Events, 10 Direct Traffic/Funeral/Escort, 9 Alarms, 9 Siren, 8 Check Welfare, 8 Fire Calls, 8 Traffic Hazard, 7 Fireworks Complaint, 7 Suspicious Vehicle, 6 Transfer 911 Call, 5 Arrests, 5 Keys Locked In Vehicle, 5 Miscellaneous Tasks, 5 Prisoner Transport, 5 Radio Test, 4 Death Investigation, 4 Follow Up, 3 Civil Matters, 3 Gas Drive Off, 3 Liquor Violations, 3 Theft, 3 Uncontrollable Juvenile, 2 Burglary/Break In/Attempt, 2 Gas Leak and 12 various other incidents. Total number of contacts to the Communications Center for the month of July was 3796 including 318 - 911 calls and 1530 Administrative calls into Dispatch.

Stena Seamann handed out a copy of her written report to the board and expressed how it was going in dispatch. She would like to see the dispatchers being able to attend additional trainings such life flight training at the departments and attend some fire meetings. Stena has been recreating the training books and working with Donna on what is needed. She is trying to get one dispatcher into an APCO virtual training in September.

She is doing commendable performance forms and looking at some retraining where needed instead of a performance plan or probation. They have been doing the quality assurance peer reviews and it was met with mixed reviews but they will keep working with that. Virginia worked with Stena to get the necessary paperwork done for Donna as TAC and LASO officer to be compliant.

Director's Report:

- NEMA was here on the 14th discuss restarting our LEPC meetings back and giving us ideas. They
 stayed for the evening to hold a training class in Burwell at the Health Department for a "Stop
 the Bleed" Training. This was a kick off to look for volunteers for the Loup Basin MRC and CERT.
- Viaero is doing testing this week on 17 of their towers in the Region 26 counties which was 911 calls from each side of each tower.
- The NCR-PET meeting in Broken Bow last week was to work on this years THIRA for the grants and also worked on the mandatory exercise calendar to be turned in.
- Platte Valley had contacted Alma to get a quote for Sargent and Ansley schools for space on our

towers for equipment for their school buses to communicate to the school. After discussion considering what we charge now and need to move forward with Diana Hurlburt made a motion with a second from Dave Larson to charge \$1000 annually for school use of our towers. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).

- Alma had attended the NRIN meeting with Jay. Still do not have a final build out of the system
 in the very southeast corner of Nebraska or the northeast. Having discussion on what we can do
 to make it a sustainable system moving forward. It is working well. For our North Central Region
 that we represent, there is an issue for Valentine connecting their new radio console to the
 system. It is a problem with the fiber connection in that area and not the wireless. We did have
 left-over PET money to purchase some equipment this year to replace some equipment that
 needed upgraded.
- The financial audit was done a couple of weeks ago by Abel and Kaps but will not be complete before next meeting.
- Wheeler County Commissioners did come over to discuss their contract with Region 26. They
 did not feel their County Attorney maybe understood the contract. They asked if our Attorney
 could contact him so there was no confusion.
- Alma reported on a written request received for a 911 recording. Alma sent it to our Attorney and was given the statute that shows it does not fit under Freedom of Information Act.
- There will be a hearing with the Department of Labor regarding unemployment that will be this next week.
- Alma asked about the security cameras to allow the Loup County Sheriff to have access for our security in an enclosed building. Joseph Smith made a motion with a second from Diana Hurlburt. Ayes (9) Nays (0) Abstain (0).
- The accountant informed us that we did not need to become a 501c3 in order to receive donations. Discussion on how we can move forward to get the information out for donations.

Other Business: Radio equipment was asked about for the schools we have using our towers now. We only have two schools that are utilizing the service and not all the time are testing. Due to age of equipment and what would need replaced if the still wanted the service would need to be discussed. Alma will talk with the schools to determine if still able to use their radios or still have them and bring to next meeting.

Joseph Smith gave a report on his meeting with Senator Ricketts through a Sheriffs meeting. He brought up the funding for 911 Centers and made him aware of the issues.

Dianna Hurlburt reported on grants and what she found from CNEDD for the garage and also the Senator Fischer and Representative Smith's grants.
